

Attitude of a Servant

Focus on others

When we forget our needs, we are able to focus on others and take care of their needs. Self-denial is the foundation of servanthood.

Think like stewards, not owners

Servanthood and stewardship go hand in hand. You cannot serve God and serve money—it's impossible. Real servants remember that God owns it all and He expects us to be good stewards of His gifts.

Focus on their ministry/mission

Real servants are too busy doing the work that God has given them to focus on or critique other ministries. We must remember that we have a common goal, doing God's work, and that competing with each other is nonsensical because we each have different gifts.

Base their identity in Christ

Servants don't need accolades to validate their work. They work for the Lord and it is His approval they seek.
