Here We Stand Project Update— Survey Results Are In!

We collected over 200 responses to the congregational survey. Surveys were made available to all members of the congregation at all three services both in hardcopy and electronically. Below are some of the top responses to several of the key questions (respondents picked their top three choices):

1. What do you like most about Epiphany?

73% Pastoral/Admin Staff 35% Friendly Congregation 46% Spiritual Fulfillment 32% Liturgy Presentation

2. Our greatest strengths to use in planning?

54% Youth Ministry 26% Diversity of Worship 42% Music Ministry 25% Liturgical Worship

30% Children's Ministry

3. Master plan goals to consider?

59% Renovate our buildings 34% Improve space utilization

48% Increase campus visibility 25% Liturgical worship

39% Grow worship space(s)

Based on survey results, Studio Red Architects and the Steering Committee developed the preliminary priorities list below.

Sample of Priorities:

- *Renovate worship center (seating quality, worship environment, narthex/fellowship, restrooms)
- *Increase campus visibility
- *Adult classroom spaces
- *Children's spaces



- O Look beyond yourself and seek to serve and bless OTHERS. The Christian faith is all about community.
- W Take the Lord's hand and WALK with Him. The Christian Life is a marathon not a sprint. I could also say take time to WORSHIP Him. As we get to know Him better we can't help but bow down before Him in worship.
- U UNDERSTAND that God has a plan and purpose for your life. You are not just taking up space until you die. God is using you for His purposes.
- P PRESS ON! Life is not always easy. A blessed life is filled with trials and challenges. We need to PERSEVERE and PRESS ON toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called us in Christ Jesus.

It is my desire to GROW UP and I pray I am not alone. May we, who call ourselves the children of God, continue to grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ and become mature men and women of God!

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF INGATHERING

The ingathering for this season has been completed.

The Women of Epiphany have delivered 88 quilts in 14 boxes, 9 fabric kits in 3 boxes and 36 school kits in 5 boxes.

These items were taken to Epiphany Lutheran Church in Houston where they were loaded onto two eighteen wheelers. Other churches in the southeastern area of Texas also brought their items to be shipped. From there the trucks went to the San Antonio area and then to the Dallas area to do the same thing. Then they were



taken to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in Maryland where they were combined and sent to various places of the world where there is a need.




Since 2003, our quilters have made and given 1,598 quilts to Lutheran World Relief. To help make quilts, quilt workshops are held the third Monday and the last Wednesday of each month at 9:00 a.m. in room 202 of the Family Life Center. No sewing experience is needed. At the Women of Epiphany meetings decisions are made about which projects such as school and

fabric kits will be made. Meetings are held the fourth Saturday of each month at 9:30 a.m. in room 203 of the AFLC.


